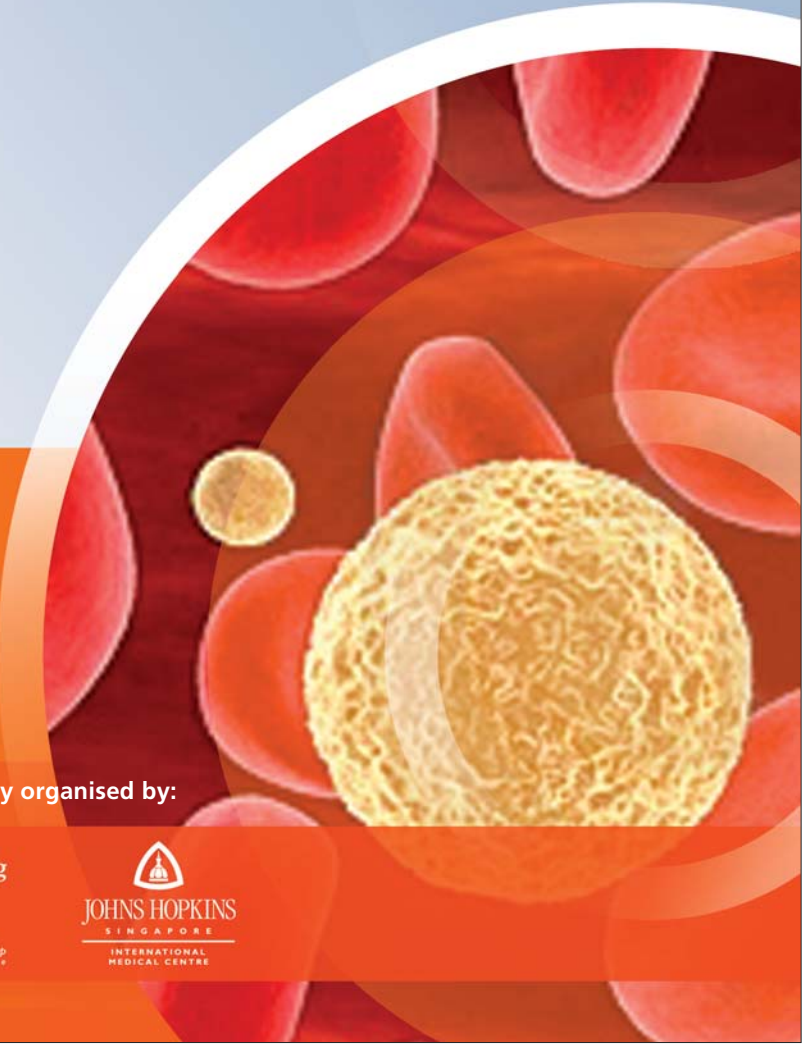

**PROF DAVID
ETTINGER**

Prof Ettinger is an Alex Grass Professor in Oncology with The Johns Hopkins University, School of Medicine in Baltimore, Maryland. In addition, he is also a Professor in medicine, otolaryngology, head and neck surgery, gynecologic and obstetrics and radiation oncology and molecular radiation sciences.

Having been a faculty member with Johns Hopkins for over 30 years, Prof Ettinger is also a member of the board of directors with the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN) as well as its guidelines steering committee. He was also the chairperson for the NCCN non-small cell lung cancer practice guidelines panel, antiemetic practice guidelines panel, and the occult primary tumour practice guidelines panel.

His research interests include new drug development and innovative multidisciplinary treatment strategies in lung cancer and sarcomas, as well as improving supportive care measures associated with cancer and its treatment.

UNG**

Prof Owen Ung is a breast and endocrine surgeon, who heads the Breast and Endocrine unit at the Royal Brisbane and Women’s Hospital (RWBH). He is a committed clinician, researcher and teacher and lectures and publishes widely. He is a principle investigator for a number of major Australian and New Zealand clinical trials relating to the management of the axilla and regional nodes in breast cancer. Through the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, he plays an active role in surgical training, assessment and examination.
